Jokkmokk (Jåhkåmåhkke in Lule Sámi language) is the centre of Jokkmokk's municipality and has approximately 2 700 inhabitants. The small town is situated along road E45, about 7 km north of the Arctic circle.

Jokkmokk has many visitors from different countries, mainly those who are interested in nature and culture.

There are many interesting places to visit, trails to hike, locally produced food to eat or to bring back home, unique shopping experiences and a great museum where you can learn about the Sami culture and the mountains.

Sami Sculpture Park

The sculpture park was created as part of the EU project 'Sápmi Sculpture Symposium', during which Sami artists created innovative pieces rooted in Sami culture, but made from non-traditional materials. The Sami Sculpture Park is by Lake Talvatis in Jokkmokk; it stretches alongside the lake from Fjällträdgården to Hotel Jokkmokk and comprises six works of art.

Uvssat Davás/The westward doors

Àkkat power station outside Jokkmokk is located in a place that is essentially the gateway to the Great Lakes and the World Heritage Site of Laponia. This is where the artists Lars Pirak, Bengt Lindström and Lars J:son Nutti have created vast paintings that in various ways symbolise life in northern Sweden.

Åjtte Fjällträdgården, the mountain garden in Jokkmokk, is part of the Åjtte Museum. Here you will find information about the wild plants in the mountain range and the nearby taiga forests. Activities

Hiking

Talvatis leisure area

There are many hiking trails around Lake Talvatis of varying lengths and elevations. The trail that runs closest to the lake (2.3 km) is a path with footbridges that is accessible for pushchairs, walking frames and wheelchairs. There are a number of barbecue/rest areas in the area.

Storknabben

Walk up along the dirt road to the top for a wonderful view of Jokkmokk and the surrounding area. A perfect place to enjoy the midnight sun when the conditions are right. *Follow Jokkmokk Jokke's road from the eastern end of Talvatissjön.*

Getberget

Getberget has several hiking trails of varying lengths, ranging from 1.6 km to approx. 10 km. You can see for miles from the summit of Getberget. There's a barbecue area at Klipptjärn.

Kvarnbäcksleden

A 7.7 km hiking trail that takes you through Jokkmokk's residential areas, from Lake Skabram via Lake Talvatis and on down towards the River Luleälv. Along the trail there are 20 information boards with details of the local wildlife and culture. Jokkmokk Infocenter has maps of the various hiking trails.

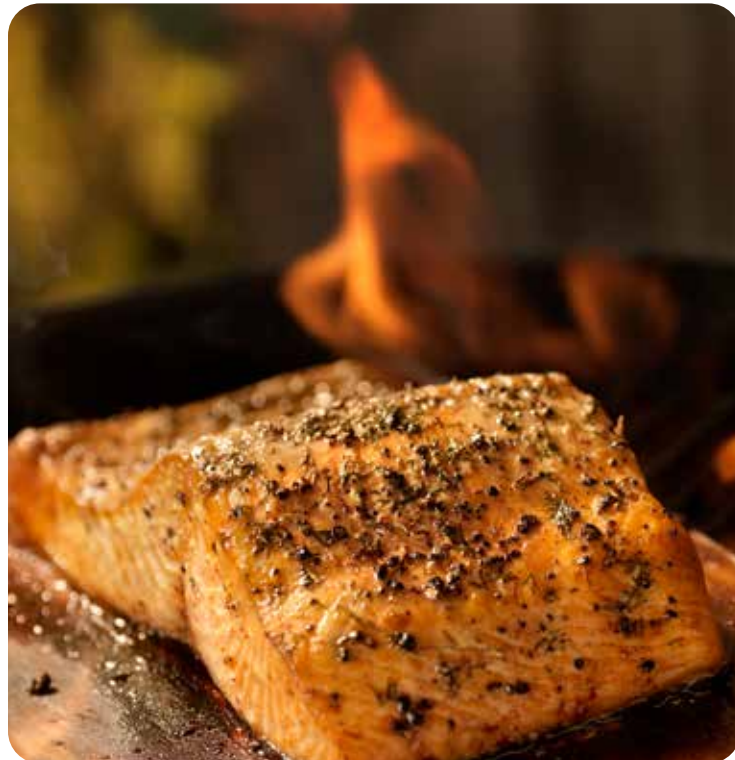

Fishing in Jokkmokk Municipality

If you're interested in fishing in Jokkmokk Municipality, it's likely you'll need to buy a fishing licence, and there are several different licences for different parts of the municipality. The licence that covers the largest area is the County Administrative Board's mountain fishing licence, 'Jokkmokkskortet', which gives you access to a number of lakes and watercourses above the agricultural boundary.

Jokkmokkskort can be purchased online at <https://natureit.se/>, or from one of the following retailers: Tourist Information in Jokkmokk, Turistcenter in Gällivare, STF's mountain station in Kvikkjokk or STF's mountain station in Ritsem. The County Administrative Board's Jokkmokkskort comes in a number of different alternatives: 24 hours, 72 hours, one week and an annual licence. The annual licence can include accompanying family members (partner and/or children living at home over the age of 16) for SEK 125 per additional person. Children under 16 years of age can fish free of charge if accompanied by a parent or guardian who has purchased a fishing licence. The annual licence is valid for the current calendar year.

Jokkmokks Jakt- och Fiskevårdsförening (hunting and fishing association) offers another fishing licence for watercourses in Jokkmokk's surrounding area. A tourist fishing licence for short periods: 24 hours for SEK 100, 72 hours for SEK 200 or one week for SEK 350; and also an annual licence for SEK 550 that includes membership of the association. These licences can be purchased from the association's office in Jokkmokk, or at Jokkmokk Infocenter. They can also be purchased online at <https://ifiske.se>

In addition to the above licences there are also several village or cooperative associations that have fishing licences for individual lakes. If you would like further information about fishing and fishing licences in Jokkmokk Municipality, there is a map service that provides details of various fishing grounds in the municipality. It also tells you what fish are found there, which licence you need for the various watercourses and where to buy them.

A long stretch of the former river channel was drained when the dam for the Letsi hydropower station was constructed. In order to prevent water levels at Vuollerim village from dropping and damaging the beaches, a mirror pond was built that has become a popular excursion on warm summer days.

PORJUS

In 1910, the construction of the power plant in Porjus began, in an area without roads. All the necessary materials had to be carried from Gällivare, about 50 km away, through forests and over mires. The power plant was inaugurated in 1915 and came to be known as “The Temple in the wilderness”.

The unique construction village and the power plant area are well worth a visit.

The church was originally a barrack owned by Vattenfall. In 1928, it was donated to the parish, which converted it into a church. It is a timber building with a wood shingle facades and roof. The church was renovated in 1957. The belfry dates back to 1921.

Harsprånget

Harsprångsfallet, the natural gorge, must have been one of Sweden's mightiest stretches of rapids, perhaps bigger than Storforsen waterfall on the River Piteälv. The river forced its way through a narrow gap 75 metres down for a run of 4.2 kilometres. The name 'Harsprånget', 'Njommelsaska' in Lule Sami, comes from the sudden twists in the rapids that are reminiscent of a darting hare. Paths with footbridges and steps take you to the viewpoint from the parking area by the E45 between Jokkmokk and Porjus (around 35 km from Jokkmokk).

920 Easy Elsie

On the mire Käimutjegge, 7 km northwest of Porjus towards Åloluokta, lies the wreckage of a British four-engined bomber from the Second World War. The plane is an Avro Lancaster MK 1 920 Easy Elsie.

How to get here: Turn off from Porjus in the direction of Åloluokta. After 7 km, a path with footbridges takes you from the road; follow it for 2 km. Around 100 m from the plane there's a lay-by and an information board that gives details of the event.

Pakkobron

Sweden's largest natural stone arch railway bridge. It was constructed at the time the inland railway was built between Jokkmokk and Porjus, 1916–1927. The bridge is surrounded by slabs of rock. It's an magical site.

How to get here: E45 from Jokkmokk in the direction of Porjus. Just before the railway, turn onto a gravel road on the left. Signposted 'Pakko 7 km'. Follow the gravel road for 9 km until the road splits. Keep right and you'll get to the bridge after around 400 metres.

Rallarstigen

The Rallarstigen is a 44 km long historical hiking trail between Gällivare and Porjus. The path goes through the northern part of the Muddus/Muttos national park and also through the nature reserve Stubbá.

Ever since the 18th century, this was an important route, first for the local population, later also for tourists and revelers. Along the trail you can see hearths, bark pits, inks and other traces that show that people have walked here long before us. Rest areas are available. Its position is determined by the tilt of the Earth's axis, which varies under the influence of the Sun, Moon and planets. For 40,000 years, the Arctic Circle oscillates back and forth within a 180 km wide area. The Arctic Circle is the outermost place - counted from the North Pole - where the sun does not set during summer solstice and does not rise during winter solstice.

In a single day, you can experience all of this and more, making Jokkmokk the perfect destination for nature lovers and history enthusiasts.

The Dam in Linabäcken

The dam in Linabäcken was originally built for log driving and to raise the water level. It was also used to power a mill, whose remains are still visible. The mill was in operation between 1910 and 1940. Today's dam is a reproduction built in 1984. At the turn of the 20th century, sawmills were an important industry, and timber was floated to the coast via waterways. Log driving required extensive labor and engineering, with log flumes and holding dams. Log driving in Linabäcken ceased in the 1920s, but continued in Norrbotten until the 1980s.

How to get here: Drive on road 97 towards Luleå. Just before Mattisudden, turn right at the sign 'Flottningsdamm.' Follow the road for about 1 km down to the house at the end of the road. Here you will find an information board and a barbecue area.



Flakabergsgruvan

FLAKABERGSGRUVAN was in operation between 1934 and 1943, and quartz and feldspar, among other minerals, were extracted here.

Today, you can explore the open-pit mine and mining sites.

How to get here: From Jokkmokk, drive 14 km on the E45 towards Kåbdalis. Turn right onto Puortnavägen and drive 5.6 km. Turn right, drive 2.7 km, then turn left. The road gets a bit rougher here, but it is possible to drive about 1 km to a turning area, depending on the type of vehicle you have. On the left side of the turning area, a path begins; follow it for about 300 m to the mine.



Serri (Sierre) Naturreservat

An easily accessible nature reserve with an accessible path.

Serri is an easily accessible nature reserve where you can hike in a magnificent forest landscape with many lakes and streams. In Serri there are several hiking trails, one of which is accessible. There is also a jetty and several rest and fire places.

Get here: From Jokkmokk drive E45 about 6 km towards Porjus. Turn right at the Messaure sign and drive about 15 km to Lake Fatjas and turn right at the Serri Nature Reserve sign. Drive approximately 8.3 km to a parking lot with an information board on the right side of the road.



Kronogård

Swedish space research

Kronogård was the place where Swedish space research started in the early 1960s, before the operations were moved to Esrange. There is still a rocket ramp here today.

Get here: Take road E45 towards Kåbdalis, after 54 km, turn right at the sign "Kronogård". After 10 km continue 400 meters. Information board and rocket ramp on your left side.



Granuddens Skvaltkvarn

One of the few remaining quail mills

Granudden's water-powered mill was built in the middle of the 19th century and was used until the Second World War. The mill was thoroughly restored in 1981, among others by Granuddsbor. In the past, all villages had mills where the farmers ground their flour. Today, Granudden's mill is one of the few mills used in Norrbotten. On special occasions, they grind in the mill, but you can visit it at any time, the door is always open.

Get here: From Jokkmokk drive E45 towards Porjus for 7 km, turn left. Follow Kvikkjokksvägen for 52.2 km and turn right at the sign "Kvarn 1". Follow the road for 1.2 km. Follow the path to the left for 150 m.



Harsprånget

Viewpoint with history, nature and memorial stone

Harsprångsfallet, the natural furrow, is said to have been one of Sweden's most powerful rivers, perhaps larger than Storforsen in Pite Älv. Through a narrow gorge, the river plunged 75 m over a distance of 4.2 km. The name Harsprånget, Njommelsaska in Lule Sami, came from the rapid turns in the fall that can be compared to those made by a hare in flight.

Get here: From Jokkmokk drive E45 towards Porjus for 34.1 km. Turn left at the Harsprångsfallet sign and park. A path and stairs with information boards lead down to the river channel.



Partafallet

The biggest fall of the beautiful Pärälven

A beautiful excursion destination with fireplace, dry toilet, fishing and hiking.

Get here: Drive road 747 towards Karats past Pärälvsbron and Puortnak, drive over Novibäcken and stop at the parking lot on the left side of the road. Follow the path towards Partafallet for about 3 km, it is signposted after the path.

Lancasterbombaren

The wreckage of the Easy Elsie aircraft

The plane that was forced to make an emergency landing on the moors outside Porjus after being damaged in a bombing attack in Narvik during the Second World War.

Easie Elsie was one of the British bombers that carried out the second attempt to sink the anchored German battleship Tirpitz in Northern Norway.

Get here: From Jokkmokk drive E45 to Porjus. Turn towards Ålloluokta, drive about 10 km and stop at the parking lot on the left. Signed with the Lancaster bomber. Follow the marked path to the aircraft for approx. 2 km. There is a fireplace, bivouac, information board, dry toilet and cold spring.

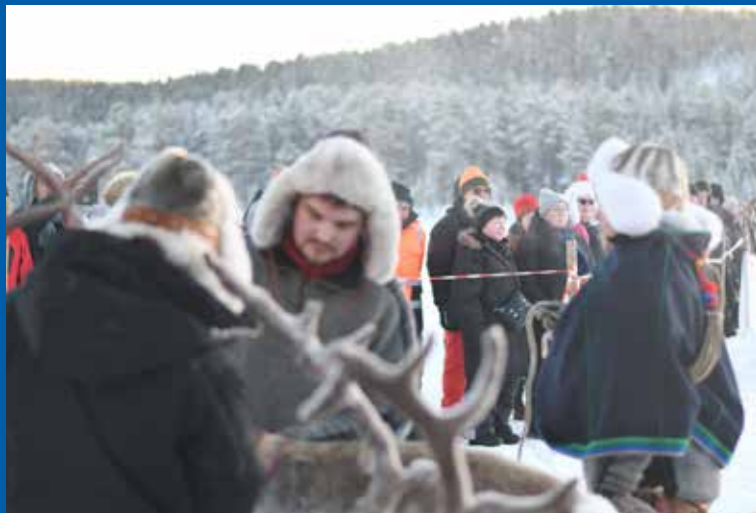
Take the Inlandsbanan to Jokkmokk this summer, a sustainable and experiential adventure in one. Summer traffic runs between June 19 and August 24.

JOKKMOKKS MARKNAD



Jokkmokk's market has a long history and is considered an unbroken tradition for more than 400 years. Fixed market places in the vicinity of the Sami's winter quarters were established by the Swedish royal power in the early 17th century in all the Lapland lands on both sides of the Gulf of Bothnia. The aim was to strengthen the state's grip on the population in the north and collect taxes, keep things in order and spread the word of God. A market in the Lapland during the coldest time of the year had many advantages. The Sami were gathered in their winter settlements in forested areas with winter grazing for the reindeer, and the frozen waterways became excellent waterways for traders, civil servants and churchmen.

Jokkmokk's market, which has become a natural meeting place, has developed into one of Northern Europe's biggest winter festivities with lots of different activities and events. Market trading is the heart of the market. The streets in the middle of the community are closed off and filled with market stalls and expectant visitors who can buy everything from traditional market sweets to reindeer meat and first-class arts and crafts.

According to tradition, the market always starts on the first Thursday in February and lasts for three intense days. Experience reindeer races, art exhibitions, snowmobile and dog sled rides, concerts, lectures, good local food and trade both indoors and outdoors. There are usually around 200 different program items throughout the week.
