JOKKMOKK

Jokkmokk had its peak during the 1950's and 1960's, when around 12,000 people lived in the municipality. Many worked in the forest or with power plant construction.

Today most people work in crafts, reindeer herding, tourism, food manufacturing or small industrial companies. Many of our citizens have a strong connection to nature, and the outdoor life is a central part of our culture. In Jokkmokk, life is quite simple. Everything you need is right around the corner; jobs, schools as well as important community services are within your reach. Here you can find everything from petrol stations and hardware stores to libraries, grocery stores, health centres, and cinemas. We have most things within walking distance.

The Sami sculpture park

The Sámi sculpture park is located alongside Lake Talvatis and was created during the EU project "Sápmi Sculpture Symposium", where Sámi artists broke new ground with works which have their roots in the Sámi culture but were carried out in non-traditional materials. The park extends along the shore of Talvatis lake, from Fjällträdgården to Hotel Jokkmokk and consists of 6 works of art.

Uvssat Davás/Dörrarna västerut

Akkats power plant just outside Jokkmokk is located at the entrance to "The big lakes" and the world heritage Laponia. The artists Bengt Lindström, Lars Pirak and Lars J:son Nutti created the monumental paintings, which in different ways connect to the life and the culture in this part of Sweden.

Activities

Hiking

Talvatis runt

At Lake Talvatis there is a hiking trail that is paved for pedestrians during the winter. It is the loop closest to the lake and it is 2.3 km long. There are several barbecue/rest areas nearby

Storknabben

Walk up along the pisted road to the top for a wonderful view of Jokkmokk and the surrounding area. It is also a perfect place to view the northern lights when the conditions are right. The road up to Storknabben is not illuminated.

Follow Jokkmokk Jocke's road from the eastern end of Talvatissjön.

Getberget

A small forest road that is paved for pedestrians in winter leads up to Klipptjärn. Here you will find a barbecue/rest area with nice views free to use. The walk is 3.2 km long round trip. Starting from Skansvägen.

Cross country skiing *Talvatis*

At lake Talvatis in the centre of Jokkmokk, there are 4 pisted ski tracks of varying lengths, 2 of which are lighted tracks. All tracks are groomed for classic style and skate.

The shortest track is 3.5 km and the longest 10.2 km. Starting point at the Fire station.

At Getberget (starting point from Fågelvägen) there are 2 ski tracks prepared for classic style. One is 6 km long and the other 10 km. Dogs are allowed on the shorter trail.

Stationshuset

There was a temporary station here while the railway was being constructed, but the first proper station building was built in 1888. Prior to 1905, the building was extended to include an upper floor where the station master lived. It was quite common for trains to stop at Murjek overnight, and the passengers had to stay at the hotel and continue their train journey the next day. The building was torn down in 1965 and replaced with the current station building. The station building has a kiosk/farm shop, and a waiting room.

KÅBDALIS

Kåbdalis is a small village halfway between Jokkmokk and Älvsbyn. The village is perhaps best known for having one of Sweden's longest alpine ski seasons, starting in October.

There is a small supermarket, a petrol station and charging station. The supermarket is available 24 hours a day (login with Swedish Bank ID) and in addition to the normal assortment, you can also find local products and delicacies here.

In Kåbdalis there is a lot of different activities to choose from. Speed down the slalom slopes, take a trip on cross-country skis, go fishing, or why not take a snow mobile ride? For children the sledding hill with the barbecue area might feel exciting enough!

After being active all day there are several restaurants to choose from. Some may want to have a quiet and pleasant evening and others certainly prefer to go with after ski.

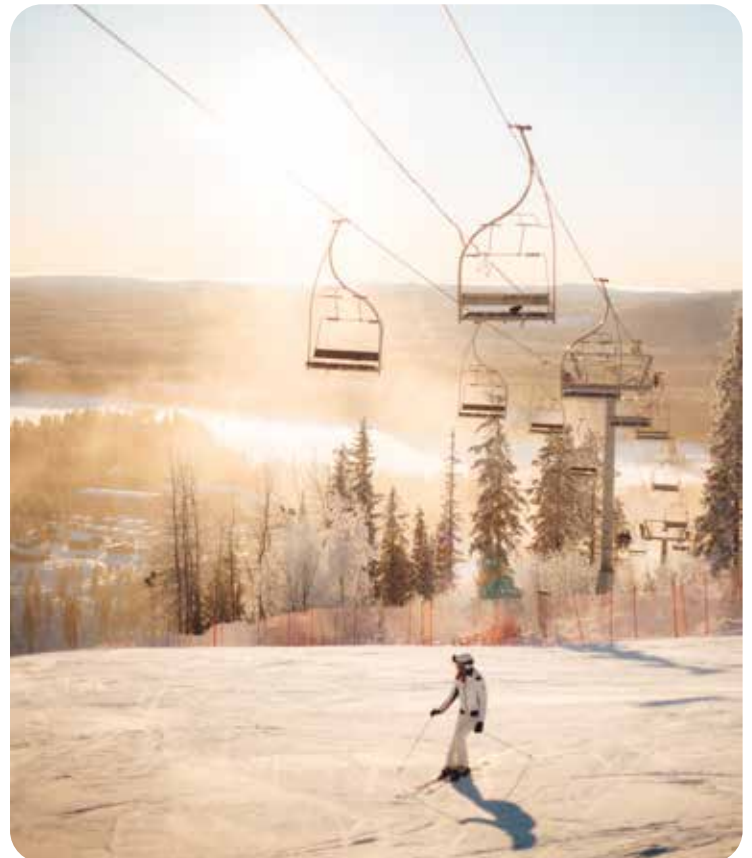
Snow mobile

In the area north of the Arctic Circle, midnight sun occurs in summer and midwinter darkness in winter. The Arctic Circle marks the limit of the midnight sun at the summer solstice. Its position is determined by the tilt of the Earth's axis, which varies under the influence of the sun, moon and planets. For 40,000 years, the Arctic Circle oscillates back and forth within a 180km wide area. The Arctic Circle is the outermost place - counted from the North Pole - where the sun does not set at the summer solstice and does not rise at the winter solstice. *Get here: Drive 17 km along road 97 towards Vuollerim or E45, for 8 km, towards Kåbdalis.*

Fishing in Jokkmokk

If you're interested in fishing in Jokkmokk Municipality, it's likely you'll need to buy a fishing licence, and there are several different licences for different parts of the Municipality. The licence that covers the largest area is the County Administrative Board's mountain fishing licence - Jokkmokkskortet - which gives you access to a number of lakes and watercourses above the agricultural boundary.

Jokkmokkskortet can be purchased online at <https://natureit.se> or from one of the following retailers: Tourist information in Jokkmokk, Turistcenter in Gällivare, STF's mountain station in Kvikkjokk or STF's mountain station in Ritsem. The county Administrative Board's Jokkmokkskortet comes in a number of different alternatives: 24 hours, 72 hours, one week and annual licence. The annual licence can include accompanying family members (partner and/or children living at home over the age of 16) for an additional fee. Children under 16 years of age can fish free of charge if accompanied by a parent or guardian who has purchased a fishing licence. The annual licence is valid for the current calendar year.

Jokkmokks Jakt- och Fiskevårdsförening (hunting and fishing association) offers another fishing licence for watercourses in Jokkmokk's surrounding area. A tourist fishing licence for short periods: 24 hours, 72 hours or one week and also an annual licence that includes membership of the association. These licences can be purchased from the association's office in Jokkmokk, or at Jokkmokk Tourist Information. They are also sold at <https://www.ifiske.se>

In addition to the above licences there are also several village or cooperative associations that have fishing licences for individual lakes. If you would like further information about fishing and fishing licences in Jokkmokk Municipality, there is a mapservice that provides details of various fishing grounds in the municipality. It also tells you what fish are found there, which licence you need for the various watercourses and where to buy them.

From the moment you arrive, you are met with smiles, stories, and a genuine desire to share their culture and love for nature with you.

The local residents are involved in many ways—as volunteers at the refreshment stations, by offering lodging and food, or simply by standing along the course to cheer on the skiers. Many families have strong ties to the ski race and see it as a matter of pride to contribute to its success. Restaurants and local businesses join forces to create a warm and welcoming atmosphere, and there is a wide range of activities and traditional Sami culture for visitors to explore.

Reindeer herding today

Reindeer herding is central to Sámi culture and is an important part of life for many Sámi people. In Sweden, all reindeer herding is carried out within one of the 51 Sámi villages in the country. A Sámi village is not a physical village but rather a geographic area where the herders of the village are organized with their own board. In the municipality of Jokkmokk, there are five Sámi villages: Sirges, Jåhkågaska tjiellde, Tuorpon, Udja, and Slakka. Only Sámi who are members of a "sameby" have the right to engage in reindeer herding in Sweden today. The "sameby" is responsible not only for reindeer herding but also for hunting, fishing, and land management, and plays a central role in preserving Sámi culture.

Reindeer herders today live a unique combination of tradition and modernity. They still follow the seasonal migrations of the reindeer, where the animals move between winter and summer grazing lands, but use modern tools such as snowmobiles, GPS, and drones to monitor the herds. The work can be very demanding, both physically and mentally, as herders must adapt to nature's changes and often spend long periods outdoors in harsh weather.

Many reindeer herders live in the community for parts of the year and often combine reindeer herding with other professions to make ends meet. However, reindeer herding remains a way to preserve Sámi identity and culture, where the reindeer is a central figure, both as a food source and in craft traditions.

Visiting a reindeer herding family provides a deeper understanding of Sámi culture and the daily life of reindeer herders. Many tourism companies offer opportunities to meet herders, see the reindeer up close, and learn about this unique way of life, which blends ancient traditions with modern challenges and innovations.





JOKKMOKKS MARKNAD



Jokkmokk's Market has a long history and is regarded as an unbroken tradition that has existed for more than 400 years. Fixed market places near the Sami's winter settlements were established by the Swedish monarchy in the early 17th century in all Lapland areas on both sides of the Bothnian Bay.

The aim was to strengthen the state's grip on the population in the north, collect taxes, hold assemblies called "ting" (sessions at court) to solve disputes and make political decisions, and spread the word of God.

Jokkmokk's Market, which has become a natural meeting place, has developed into one of northern Europe's largest winter festivities with a great many different activities and events. Market trading constitutes the heart of the market. The streets in the centre of the community are closed and filled with market traders and visitors full of anticipation who can buy everything from traditional market sweets to reindeer meat and top-quality handicrafts.

In keeping with tradition, the market always starts on the first Thursday of February and lasts for three intensive days. You can experience reindeer racing competitions, art exhibitions, snowmobile and dog sled tours, concerts, lectures, tasty local food and trading both outdoors and indoors. There are usually about 200 different items on the programme during the whole week.

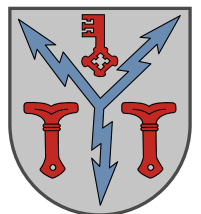
